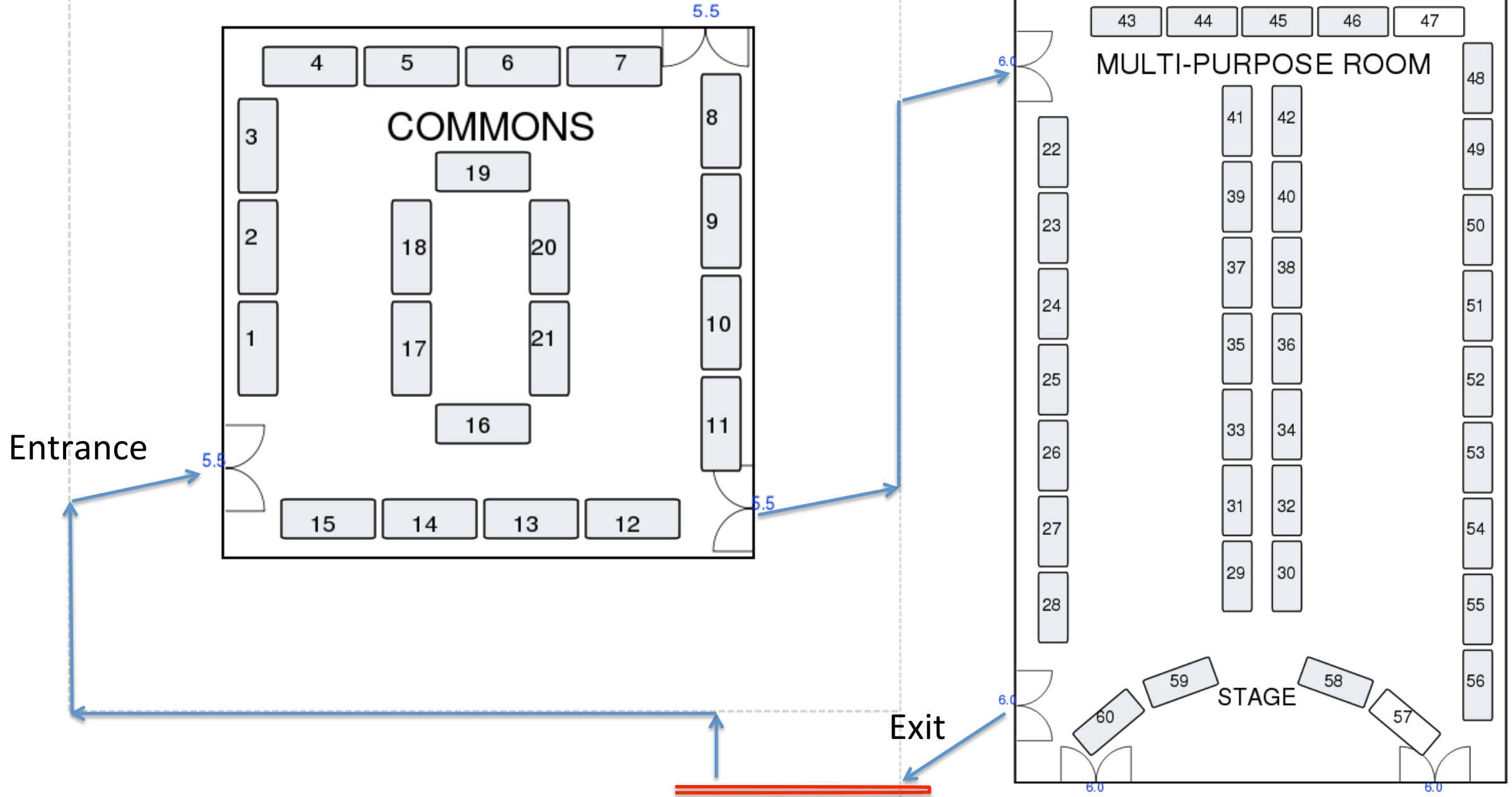

Overnight or day camp?</li> <li>• Should you consider a specialty camp that offers a focused curriculum, such as basketball, or a special-needs camp designed for specific physical or medical disability?</li> <li>• How long is a session? A child may attend camp for a week or two – or an entire summer.</li> <li>• Is the staff trained in safety, supervision, counseling, problem solving, and other issues important to working with young children?</li> <li>• Is the price all-inclusive or do extra charges apply for transportation, food service, group pictures, t-shirts, special skills instruction such as horseback riding, and other items?</li> <li>• Are discounts or scholarships available?</li> <li>• For day camps, if before and after care is offered to accommodate working parents, who will be supervising children and what activities take place?</li> <li>• Is lunch and/or a snack served, or do campers bring their own?</li> <li>• If swimming is offered, are lessons included, or is swimming only recreational? Does one counselor stay with a group all day? Or are campers free to roam from one activity to another? It is a parent-led organization with two parents and one full-time, paid staff on duty each day. Our goal is to help foster learning through interacting with other children of their own age. We focus on the whole child—educational, social, emotional, and physical developments—as s/he gains greater self-awareness and place in the world. **Children outside the age range may be accepted with permission. Our summer co-op is partially subsidized by DC Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR), which helps keep tuition low -- lower than most camps in the area. DPR also provides us with classrooms at various DPR recreation centers in the district. In this way, we are somewhat unusual. We began as a community experiment to offer summer camp options for young children who do not typically meet the minimum age requirement of many summer camps in the DC area (i.e. most summer camps require a minimum age of 3 years). In 2016, we operated out of one DPR recreation center; in 2017, we grew to three locations; in 2018, we are getting ready to open five locations in the District of Columbia: Macomb, Hardy, Hamilton, Kennedy, and Ridge Road Recreation Centers. Macomb and Hamilton are full-day programs (9 AM to 3 PM, Monday thru Friday); Hardy, Kennedy, and Ridge Road are half-day programs (9 AM to 12 PM, Monday thru Friday).
