Overnight or day camp? • Should you consider a specialty camp that offers a focused curriculum, such as basketball, or a special-needs camp designed for specific physical or medical disability? • How long a session? A child may attend camp for a week or two – or an entire summer. • Is the staff trained in safety, supervision, counseling, problem solving, and other issues important to working with young children? • Is the price all-inclusive or do extra charges apply for transportation, food service, group pictures, t-shirts, special skills instruction such as horseback riding, and other items? • Are discounts or scholarships available? • For day camps, if before and after care is offered to accommodate working parents, who will be supervising children and what activities take place? • Is lunch and/or a snack served, or do campers bring their own? • If swimming is offered, are lessons included, or is swimming only recreational? ∅ Does one counselor stay with a group all day?
